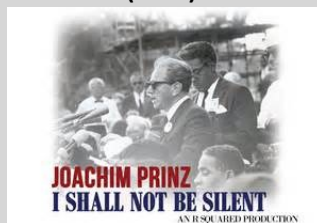

A documentary film about a rabbi who would not be silenced, from synagogues in Hitler's Berlin to the March on Washington in 1963.

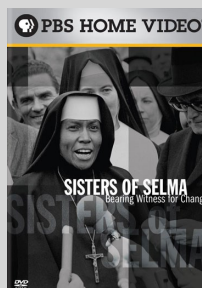
