Training is **FREE**, but only open to 30 participants on a *first come, first serve basis*. A lunch (including vegetarian option) and training manual will be provided.

Provides in-depth training on Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) and Trauma Informed Care (TIC). ACES are experiences such as childhood abuse, neglect & other traumatic stressors that can lead to social & health problems later in life. TIC is an organizational structure and treatment framework that involves understanding, recognizing, and responding to the effects of all types of trauma. TIC can help survivors rebuild a sense of control and empowerment.

This training also includes opportunities for participants to engage in the promotion of resilience and identify and practice trauma-informed strategies. This training is provided by Gundersen Health System through the support of Monroe County's Mental Health Workgroup.
